Dear Michael,

Thank you for your enquiry regarding the materials comprising the manufacture of your packaging. I hope the following will be of some help.

The cardboard is made up of 3 layers of paper milled at Kawerau by Carter Holt Harvey and consists of between 60 and 80% recycled pulp and 20 to 40% virgin Kraft pulp which is bound on a corrugator using an edible starch formulation to create a cardboard sheet known as *S35C* as used for the job you are having run.

This will then be printed using a water-based ink from Mainland Inks Ltd. The boxes will then be glued using Henkel cold adhesive 218.148ALV which is also non-toxic and water based.

Your product complies with F.D.A. parts 21CFR 175.300, 176.170, & 176.180. (These are food grade standards of packaging).

The cardboard meets F.D.A. regulations Title 21, parts 170-199 dated 1<sup>st</sup> April 2002, and MAF IS6 dated 1<sup>st</sup> October 1999. No banned substances listed in "Restriction of Hazardous Substance Directive 2002/95/EC" are present in the manufacture process.

When the life of the product has ceased, neither the ink nor glue needs to be recovered as the entire product is 100% recyclable, or if desired, 100% bio-degradable.
